
Yi Kai at Dolly Fiterman Fine Arts

Born in China, Yi Kai studied traditional ink painting before emigrating to America in 1990. In less than a decade, he has transformed the basic aspects of China's venerable pictorial tradition into a personal expression charged with Western values. The exhibition, Millennial Confluence: A Decade of Paintings bu Yi Kai, at Dolly Fiterman Fine Arts (9 June - October 1999), includes forty works. The show focuses on the cultural blending that has always defined America's social fabric. Yi Kai combines Western icons including maps and flags in primary colors, with Eastern symbolism and calligraphic brushwork. While the work of Pollock, De Kooning, Johns and Rauschenberg provide visual context for Yi Kai's abstracted paint surfaces, the integration of themes as disparate as Ameri-

can individualism and Confucian family values reflect the unique insight of an immigrant Chinese artist. Yi Kai's paintings further affirm that America is currently the best demonstration that cultural diversity works and that, at the time of the millennium, this universal harmony will be even more fully realized.
